

## Virtual event video 3 – Camp site

This is the red camping zone, which is the general camp site. This is where the majority of festival goers will want to camp. People aged 16 and over generally come here. Lots of partying; it's 24 hours day; lots of alcohol being consumed. Pretty tricky in terms of health and safety and security so things that you want to be thinking about for the camp site are:

- the number of tents that are likely to be in here, so think about the number of people and the number of passes that are going to be given for this camp site;
- Making sure that people don't decide to have a barbecue in their tent and things like that, because believe it or not people come back from late night performances they fancy something to eat, they've got a disposable barbecue sitting there, chances are they might think it's a good idea to use it.

There will be security on the entrance here to make sure that the right people are coming in and out and so on, so you want to be thinking about how that is managed.

What the logistics people here will be thinking about is toilets and so on; the number of toilets that they are going to have here. They are also going to be thinking about water supply. You can see where I am standing here there is a water pipe going the length of this strip down the edge of the camp site. Some of that is drinking water, some of it isn't so you have to be careful that it is all signed and so on so that people don't end up drinking water that is full of chemicals.

The other thing you want to be thinking about is all this pipework that is running down here. How do you make that safe? People do need to have water, it's a health and safety issue as well, they need to have fresh water for drinking and washing. Pipework goes hand in hand with that, so how do you make sure that people aren't tripping over them as they are coming in and out of the festival site?

This is the red camping site, it is the biggest on the map. It stretches a fair distance and will have a lot of people in it, so there is a lot to be concerned with health and safety for this.
